Services include (but are not limited to) respite care, habilitation training specialist (HTS), homemaker, architectural modifications, employment services, transportation.

➤ **In-Home Supports Waiver/Adult**

Provides up to \$15,000 per year for services to people who are 18 years of age and older who have mental retardation and live at home with their families. Services include (but are not limited to) respite care, residential rehabilitation, home health care, employment services, and transportation.

➤ **Medicaid Home and Community-Based Waiver**

Provides in-home and community support services for eligible individuals with developmental disabilities. Funding limitations have produced a long waiting list for this program.

➤ **Residential (Nonwaiver)**

Intermediate Care Facility/Mental Retardation (ICF/MR) - DDSD operates two resource centers, which provide 24 hour supervision, training, therapies, health and medical care. Individuals over the age of six may be admitted, if it is determined the ICF/MR is the least restrictive, most appropriate residential environment available.

➤ **Residential (Waiver)**

Provides agency adult companion services, assisted living, group home, specialized foster care, supported living, case management, health services, habilitation training specialists, homemaker services, therapy services, respite, family training, assistive technology/adaptive equipment, architectural modifications, and transportation.

ODHS has a Capital Assistance Program through the Federal Transit Administration that helps purchase vehicles and other equipment for private nonprofit organizations and public agencies under certain conditions for the special needs of the elderly and people with disabilities in urbanized and nonurbanized areas. Applicant organizations must provide 17 percent of the total cost of the vehicles and other equipment. The Federal Transit Administration will finance the remaining 83 percent of the cost for approved projects.
