"Unsung Lullabies: Coping with Miscarriage," VHS tape, 47 minutes. Injoy Videos, 3970 Broadway, Suite B4, Boulder CO 80304, (800) 326-2082. Considering that approximately 1 in 5 pregnancies end in miscarriage, it is surprising that most couples are surprised by the grief they experience. This video shares the stories of eight women and men.

"We Will Remember," James Miller, 1992. VHS tape, 10 minutes. Willowgreen Productions, Fort Wayne, IN. Available from Compassion Books, (704) 675-9670. A gentle video that invites bereaved people to pause and remember. Helpful for rituals and commemorative services, blends images from nature with serene music.
